

# **Restorative Aide Training**

Arkansas Health Care Foundation (AHCF) offers a 24 clock hour class over the course of 3 days to provide the necessary training and certification for individuals seeking to become a Certified Restorative Nursing Aide in a long term care facility. The course will include two and one half days of classroom instruction followed by one half day of return skill demonstration.

Restorative Nursing Aides are responsible for carrying out nursing interventions that promote the resident's ability to adapt and adjust to living as independently and safely as possible. Restorative Nursing Programs are designed by a licensed nurse with input from the interdisciplinary team and include modalities and treatments in accordance with the comprehensive and individualized care plan. Compliance with the restorative program includes planning of modalities for both individuals and groups, implementation of the restorative care, detailed documentation and monitoring the response to the programs.

Instructors will cover content that includes principles of physical, occupational and speech therapy, and be taught a step by step process that can be used to provide restorative nursing care as well as the medical record documentation necessary. The certification course focuses on developing caring and passionate professionals that are able to address range-of motion and mobility issues that directly impact the resident's care and quality of life.
